# Text: Fish and Chips

## Fish and chips

Did you know that one of Britain's most popular takeaway food is fish and chips? The first fish and chips shops opened at the end of the 19th century and since then they have become very popular all over the country.

If you want to try this traditional takeaway food, you have to find a local chippy. You'll probably realise you are near one by the smell. They are normally small shops, often in the middle of a housing area, and are only open at lunchtime and in the evening.

Don't always expect to find somewhere to sit and there won't be a fancy menu. Just ask for fish and chips. In up-market chippies you might be asked whether you would like haddock, cod or plaice.

Don't expect to get your meal immediately. The fish will probably be cooked especially for you and you will have to wait patiently in the queue. Don't worry if the fish does not look like any fish you've seen in Germany. Before the fish is fried in hot oil, it is dipped in batter. This is made from flour, eggs and water and goes brown and crispy when it is cooked. And the chips? They are made from thick sticks of potato and are deep fried.

Don't expect a plate and never ask for a knife and fork. People usually eat this meal straight from the paper it's wrapped in, using their fingers. Finally, to be really British, you must add salt and vinegar. This is free to all customers and you should make sure you take enough. Only foreigners would ask for mayonnaise. Then you can enjoy your meal while you walk down the street.
